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IETF Chair

IETF financing sources

- Two sources of income:
 - ISOC members
 - Pays for RFC Editor, insurance & some other expenses – in the range of USD 500-600K/year
 - Meeting fees
 - Pays for the meetings and the secretariat
- The work of the IANA, the IESG, the IAB and the IETF members is not paid for through the IETF process

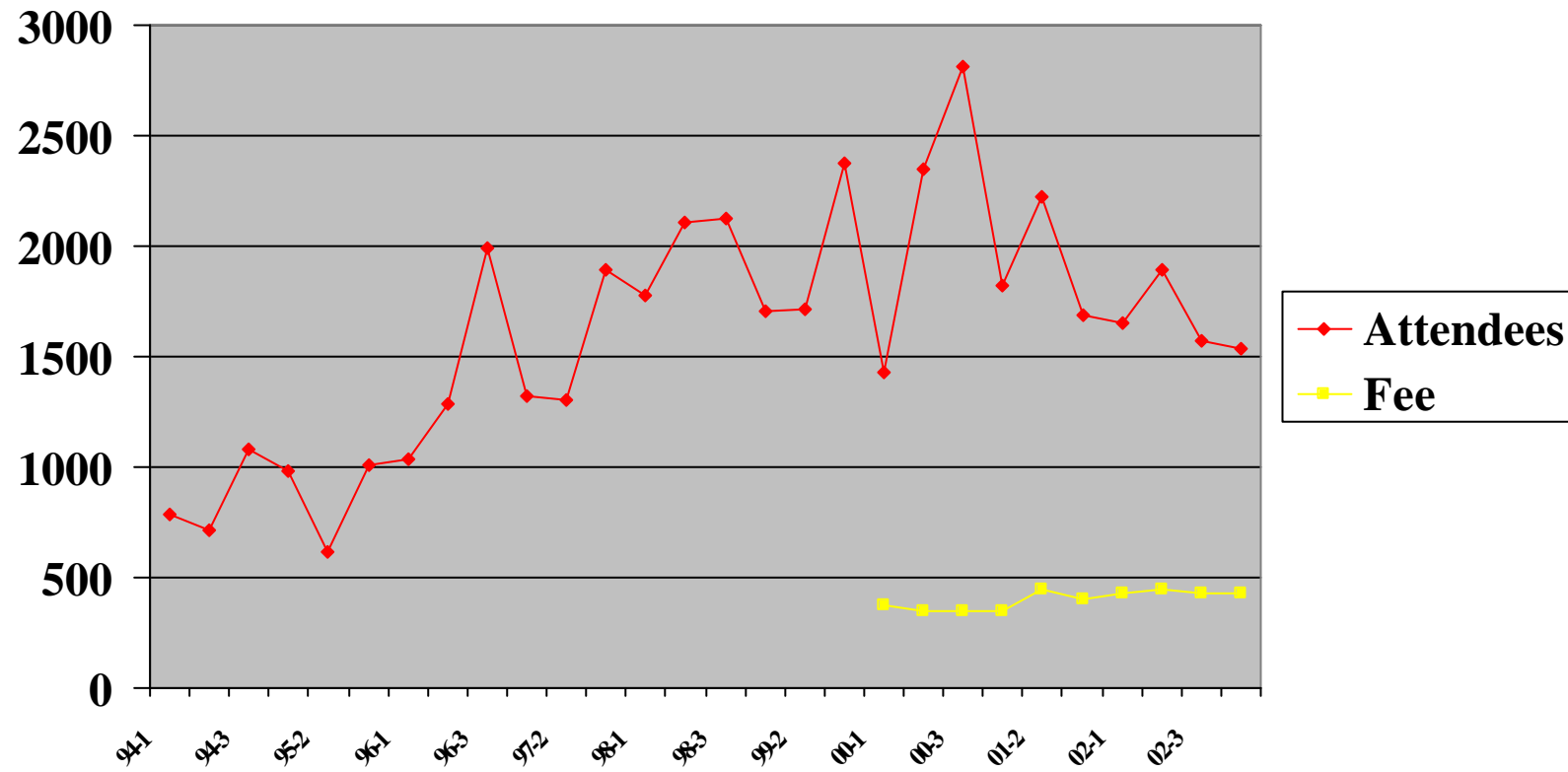

The reasons for changes

- Added two people to secretariat staff
- Yokohama was expensive to run
- Fewer people at the meetings
 - 2001: 6172 attendees @USD 431
 - 2002: 5158 attendees @USD 449

Predicting The Future

- Assume that we can get by with present staff & expenses (no more assistance needed), and 5% a year expense growth
- Assume that we get 1600 attendees per meeting (slight increase for future years)
- Assume that fees stay the same (USD 425), with the same number of latecomers
- Assume no new income

Doing Something About It

- Reduce expenses
 - Cut the cookies
 - and pay for the meeting rooms. No cigar.
 - Shift more work from "professional" to "voluntary".
- Increase income
 - Raise the meeting fees
 - Make more people pay fees
 - Not necessarily at the IETF meetings
 - Get more sponsors for the meetings
 - "this cookie is brought to you by Acme Corp."
 - Do other activities that people are willing to pay for
 - Make the IETF an industry consortium

How should we decide?

- The IETF community needs to decide what's important to it
- The IETF Chair needs to instruct the secretariat on what to do
- We need to act deliberately. But soon.
